THE UNIVERSITY PERCUSSION ENSEMBLE

The University Percussion Ensemble is one of two classical percussion ensembles at the School of Music. The University Percussion Ensemble is devoted to the performance of standard percussion ensemble repertoire which balances the avantgarde music performed by The Oregon Percussion Ensemble. Percussionists majoring in music perform in both of the two percussion ensembles.

THE OREGON PERCUSSION ENSEMBLE Professor Charles Dowd, Music Director and Conductor

The Oregon Percussion Ensemble is a consortium of percussionists specializing in the performance of modern classical percussion chamber music. In 1996 The Oregon Percussion Ensemble and Charles Dowd were nominated for the Laurel Leaf Award of the American Composers Alliance in New York City for distinguished achievement in fostering and encouraging American music. Now in its 30th season, the group is known for its performances of the music of Frank Zappa, John Cage, Lou Harrison, Edgard Varèse, Steve Reich. Iannis Zenakis, Edison Denisov, Meyer Kupferman, William Kraft and for premieres of works by cutting edge, avant-garde composers. Broadcast performances include WGBH Boston's "The Art of the States," heard in 40 countries, and an NPR national broadcast of a Dowd composition for Gamelan Suranadi Sari Indra Putra. Past performances include Percussive Arts Society International Conventions in Los Angeles and San Jose (by competitive audition), a 1992 John Cage memoriam, a 1992 Lou Harrison 75th birthday tribute in Portland, Seattle, and Portland Percussion Festivals, and the 1984 International Society for Music Education at Silva Hall. The group has had touring performances in Palo Alto, San Iose. San Francisco, Los Angeles, Boise, Spokane, Seattle, Ellensburg, Portland, and throughout the Northwest. All members of the ensemble are graduate or undergraduate percussionists majoring in music at the University of Oregon. Ensemble alumni hold graduate degrees from Juilliard, Eastman, Peabody, New England Conservatory, Manhattan, and USC, and perform in concert halls and recording studios in the U.S., Canada, and Europe.

DAVID JOHNSON Guest marimba soloist & composer

Los Angeles percussionist, mallet player and composer DAVID JOHNSON performs internationally and is renowned as a "player's player". He has performed with Pierre Boulez, Seiji Ozawa, Simon Rattle, Esa Pekka Solonen, Andre Previn, Los Angeles Philharmonic, Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra, Los Angeles Master Chorale, Long Beach Symphony, Pacific Symphony, San Francisco Opera, Western Opera Theater, Berkshire Music Center and many others.

Mr. Johnson is a former member of the famed Blackearth Percussion Group and has performed at The Cabrillo Festival of Contemporary Music in Santa Cruz, CA.

David Johnson has performed with the Los Angeles Monday Evening Concerts, the Ojai Festival, the Independent Composers Association, the LA Arts Festival, the LA/Sitka Chamber Music Festival, Composers Inc., the LA Philharmonic New Music Group, and the California Ear Unit. David has been the percussionist with the Los Angeles chamber group XTET since 1987 and the New Century Players in California since 1991. As a marimba and vibraphone player, he has played with the Kim Richmond Jazz Orchestra, Vinny Golia Large Ensemble, Yousef Lateef, Mel Torme, Dave Brubeck, Maureen Mc Govern, his Lian Ensemble, Just Strings, the music groups of Harry Partch, Roger Williams and he co-leads the Dark Wing Trio with Ivan Johnson and Houman Pourmehdi.

David Johnson was the winner of the 1995PAScomposition competition for "Quartz City" for vibraphone soloist and percussion quintet, has been a featured artist at PASIC, and has been on the faculty of CalArts since 1991.

He has worked in the recording industry. His credits include: AFM film orchestras for The American President, Fantasia 2000, the Glass House, Head Above Water, Hush, In Too Deep, Invaders from Mars, Lolly Madonna XXX, Murder at 1600, Nick of Time, Rapid Fire, Redwood Curtain, Reflection of Fear, Rounders, the Scarecrow, Seaquest DSV, Set It Off, slight Case of Murder, Species, Sweet November. Swordfish, Tiny Toons, Urban Legend, the Vagrant, Virtuosity, XXX and the Matrix.

CHARLES DOWD

A native New Yorker, Charles Dowd is principal timpenist of the Eugene Symphony, Oregon Bach Festival, Cascade Festival of Music, Oregon Festival of American Music, Oregon Coast Music Festival and substitute principal timpanist of the Oregon Symphony in Portland. For thirty years Dowd was principal timpanist of the Cabrillo Music Festival in Santa Cruz, which won 18 consecutive ASCAP awards under Dennis Russell Davies and Marin Alsop. Dowd performs throughout the USA, in France, Germany and in Canada. He has performed in Carnegie Hall, RCA Studios New York, and with the Juilliard Orchestra, San Francisco Symphony and many others. Dowd records on MusicMasters, Warner Bros., Black Saint/Soul Note, PAUSA, Hanssler Germany, cdmUSA, Columbia, and KM Los Angeles record labels, and has written seven books on percussion performance, sold worldwide. His musical training includes DMA residency work with Saul Goodman at the Juilliard School, a master's degree at Stanford and a bachelor's degree from San Jose State University, both with Anthony J. Cirone of the San Francisco Symphony. Dowd is a Philip H. Knight Professor of Music at the University of Oregon School of Music and conductor/music director of the Oregon Percussion Ensemble, specializing in the premieres of avant-garde works for modern percussion chamber ensemble.

ABOUT THE CONDUCTOR &

W. Sean Wagoner, conductor, is Instructor of Percussion Studies at the University of Oregon School of Music and holds the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Percussion Performance from the University of Oregon. Wagoner is principal timpanist of the Oregon Mozart Players, principal percussionist of the Eugene Opera Orchestra, and is a member of the Eugene Symphony percussion section. He also performs as a freelance artist with the Oregon Symphony, the Oregon Bach Festival, and the Cascade Festival of Music. Wagoner's recording credits include: Percussionist, the Grammy Awardwinning Hännsler recording of Krzysztof Penderecki's Credo, with the Oregon Bach Festival; Multi-percussionist, George Crumb's An Idyll for the Misbegotten and Iannis Xenakis' Persephassa for broadcast worldwide on WGBH Boston's Art of the States and Radioemisoras 96.5 FM XIII Festival de Música Contemporánea in Santiago, Chile; Drummer, the Platinum selling album Zoot Suit Riot: The Swingin' Hits of the Cherry Poppin' Daddies.

Erica Drake graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education from the University of Oregon in June 2003, and completed her secondary teaching license in August 2004. She is currently a candidate for the Master's of Music in Percussion Performance at the University of Oregon as a student of Professor Charles Dowd, and holds a Graduate Teaching Fellowship in Wind Conducting. Erica is currently principal percussionist of the University Symphony Orchestra and a member of the Oregon Wind Ensemble. She also performs with The Oregon Percussion Ensemble and the Praxis Marimba Quartet, and directs the Oregon Campus Band.

The SOU Percussion Ensemble is dedicated to the performance of contemporary percussion repertoire and providing the ensemble members with a variety of percussive experiences. Repertoire ranges from contemporary classical to world traditions to jazz and rock inspired compositions. The ensemble gives two full concerts at the university each year as well as many performances throughout the university, the Southern Oregon community, and the Pacific Northwest.

Terry Longshore is active as a performer, composer, and educator of percussion and has performed throughout the U.S. as well as in Sweden, Mexico, Canada, Brazil, India, and the U.K. He performs regularly as a soloist and with percussion duo Skin & Bones, trio The Rhythm Method, and multi-media ensemble Sonoluminescence. Major festivals Longshore has performed at include the Bang on a Can Festival in New York City, the Britt Classical Festival, the Festival of New American Music, the Los Angeles Philharmonic Green Umbrella Series, the Cabrillo Music Festival, the Oregon Shakespeare Festival, and the Cycle of Percussion at the National Center of the Arts in Mexico City. He can be heard on numerous CD and motion picture recordings and has premiered many compositions for solo percussion, chamber ensemble, and symphony orchestra. His most recent recording work includes the music of Stanford composer Mark Applebaum and two works for composer William Kraft. Longshore's composition Crash, a cymbal trio for solo percussionist, is published by Go Fish Music. Terry Longshore is a Yamaha Performing Artist and a Zildjian and Vic Firth Educational Artist.

Longshore holds bachelor's degrees from the California State University at Fresno and Sacramento. He earned the master's and doctoral degrees in contemporary music performance from the University of California, San Diego where he studied under percussion virtuoso Steven Schick. Longshore studied tabla with Pandit Swapan Chaudhuri at the Ali Akbar College of Music and has undertaken additional studies in Indian classical music with Kartik Seshadri and Arup Chattopadhyay. He has taught at several universities and colleges and currently holds the position of Associate Professor of Music and Director of Percussion Studies at Southern Oregon University.
